## My Spartan Story and Peace Corps Prep

While Peace Corps Prep is not a transcriptable certificate, the four competencies are integrated with the <u>Spartan Experience Record</u>, providing an official MSU record of your involvement in the program.



The Spartan Experience Record documents student learning and engagement in non-credit bearing experiences and can be requested from the Registrar along with your transcript. The work and volunteer experiences, language acquisition, intercultural exploration and reflection, and leadership and professional development opportunities you undertake as a Peace Corps Prep participant can all appear on this record, along with other validated MSU co-curricular activities.

## What does a Peace Corps Prep Spartan Experience Record look like?

Each of the four PC Prep competencies is a separate "position" in the Spartan Experience Record, all falling under the activity title "Peace Corps Prep Program Competencies." This means that even if for some reason you do not complete the full requirements to obtain the PC Prep certificate, you may be able to validate one or more of the individual competencies and still have those sections appear on your SER.
