

Robert S. Glew

Robert Glew is assistant dean for the MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program, director of the Center for Advanced Study of International Development, and professor of international development studies at Michigan State University. Dr. Glew has over 25 years of experience working on issues of international development and international education. He has taught courses on international development, cultural change, and socio-cultural diversity.

In the area of international education, Dr. Glew co-edited, *International and Language Education for a Global Future: Fifty Years of Title VI and Fulbright-Hays Programs*, Michigan State University Press, 2010. He has also co-authored numerous articles on the role of indigenous plant foods in the diets and lives of local communities in Africa.

Dr. Glew is the faculty coordinator for MSU's Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program, a U.S. Department of State-funded professional development program for mid-career professionals from designated countries working on issues of economic development. He has co-directed successful collaborative projects with university, NGO, and governmental partners in Burkina Faso, China, Ghana, Iraq, Kenya, Mali, Malawi, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, South Africa, and Tanzania. He speaks French and Hausa and has also studied Fulfulde.

Dr. Glew earned his PhD in anthropology from Michigan State University (1997), MA in African Languages and Literature from the University of Wisconsin—Madison (1989), and BA in African Languages and Literature from the University of Wisconsin--Madison (1986).
